

**MIAMI SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS**  
**2019 – 2020**  
**SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE SELECTIONS**

**Anne Dyck Memorial Scholarship (\$100.00)**

- Awarded to a graduating student who is respectful and kind to all students and staff.
- Student who best exemplifies Anne’s vibrant personality in their demeanor. A smile on her face was a permanent fixture.
- Priority will be given to a student who participates in the choral arts and has an appreciation for music.
- Participation in school drama will also be a consideration.
- Post-Secondary education is not a requirement.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Continued until funds run out.
- The funds for this scholarship will be managed by MPSEO.

**Blair Sharpe Career Scholarship (\$500.00)**

- Awarded to a graduating student who is planning to further his/her education/training.
- A written 200-300 word essay reflecting on the statement, “What growing up in Miami and Area has given me”.
- ***The Scholarship will be awarded once proof of acceptance into a training course or program is provided to the Miami Post-Secondary Educational Organization.***
- ***This Scholarship can be awarded for up to one year after Graduation.***
- The Post-Secondary Committee will select the recipient on behalf of the family.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and a MPSEO representative will revisit distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

**Boyne Chapter of Retired Teachers (Miami’s next year 2021).**

- Awarded to a student entering the field of Education.
- Awarded every 3rd year – Carman, Elm Creek, Miami
- ***Cheque will be written when proof of acceptance into institution is provided to the Chapter. The scholarship can be given up to one year after graduation.***

**Brigitte Grenier Memorial (approx. \$400.00)**

**(Based on 2019 financial information this award may continue for an additional 5-10 years 2023 – 2028 dependent upon interest rates).**

- Possible interest in communications career.
- Expresses creativity and an interest in writing.
- Active in school activities (i.e. drama, yearbook, student council, fundraisers, canteen).
- Interest in making school a better place - school spirit.
- Approximate academic average of 60%.
- Never failed a grade.
- Makes no distinction between juniors and seniors.
- Friendly, outgoing, sunny disposition.
- Athletics is not a major consideration.
- ***Credit Union states that money will be released upon proof of post-secondary education registration (up to one year after graduation).***

### **Calvin Zacharias Memorial Award (\$100.00) LAST YEAR 2020**

- Awarded to the student who best exemplifies a dedication to extra-curricular activities, a talent for team leadership and a determination in reaching team goals.

### **Carman Community Health Centre (\$250.00)**

- Offered to a graduating student from each of the following schools: Miami School, Carman Collegiate, Elm Creek School, and Dufferin Christian School (total of 4 scholarships) who plans to pursue education in the field of health care at an accredited post-secondary institution.
- For the purposes of this scholarship “the field of health care” refers to a broad range of health care professions concerned with the maintenance or restoration of the health of the body or mind.
- Student must have achieved necessary credits to allow him/her to enter into a post-secondary education program.
- Student will have displayed a high level of academic achievement at the secondary level.
- Preference will be given to a student who shows an interest in health care through volunteerism, community involvement, and/or employment history.
- The choice of the recipient will be made by the designated awards committee in each school.

### **Jason Barton Massage Therapy Bursary (\$150.00 – Jason to choose recipient)**

- Applicants must submit a short description, personally addressed to Mr. Barton, as to why they are qualified for this bursary. Hand this bursary request in to the office with all other scholarship requests.
- 80% academic average.
- Must be continuing on to post-secondary education entering a health related field.
- Displays perseverance, hard, work, and dedication

### **Cory Rutter Construction Career Scholarship (\$100.00)**

- Awarded to a graduating student who has expressed interest in attending a post-secondary institution leading to accreditation in a trades program. Trades may include but are not limited to; Carpentry, Machinist, Electrical, Mechanics, Plumbing, and Welding.
- Recipient must show proof of school and community involvement in portfolio.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and a MPSEO representative will revisit distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

### **Gary Smart Memorial Scholarship (\$100.00) – Friends & Family of Gary Smart**

- Awarded to a student who best exemplifies a love and commitment for their school and community. This student actively gives their time to their school and community in addition to encouraging volunteerism in others.
- This student values the involvement in sports and the lessons learned from partaking in team and individual sports. This student has also demonstrated a respect for coaches and officials in all levels and areas of sport.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- ***Money will be released upon proof of acceptance into a post-secondary institution and may be awarded up to one year after graduation. It is the recipient’s responsibility to forward an acceptance letter to the chairperson of MPSEO if they are choosing to wait for a year to attend a post-secondary institution.***
- Continued until funds run out.
- The funds for this scholarship will be managed by MPSEO.

### **Miami 4H Activity Club Long Standing Commitment Scholarship (\$100.00)**

#### **Provided up to a maximum of 3 recipients**

- Awarded to a graduate who has been enrolled in the Miami 4H Activity Club for a minimum of 7 years. Students who have spent some of those years in the Miami Beef Club may use those as part of the 7 years however enrollment in 2 clubs simultaneously will still only count for one year.
- Recipient must have been enrolled and achieved the year of graduation.
- Recipient conveys the values of 4H and what being a part of the 4H organization means to them in their portfolio presentation.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and a MPSEO representative will revisit Distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

### **Miami Agricultural Society (\$250.00)**

- Offered to a student planning to further his/her education/training.
- ***Scholarship will be awarded once proof of acceptance into a training course or program is provided to the Miami School, and can be awarded up to one year after Graduation.***
- Applicants must provide evidence of how they meet scholarship criteria in their portfolio presentation.
- Explains in a short 200-300-word essay why/how agriculture plays an important role in the applicant's life and community.
- Makes school and community a better place.
- Is active in school activities and community events.
- Displays a commitment to volunteerism in his or her Community.
- Displays leadership, communication skills, and a dedication to hard-work.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- The Miami Post-Secondary Committee will select the recipient on behalf of the Miami Ag Society
- **The Miami Ag Society will review the scholarship value and criteria annually.**

### **Miami Fire & Rescue Scholarship (\$250.00)**

- A. Awarded to a graduate related to a past or present member of **Miami** Fire & Rescue AND furthering their education/training following graduation.
  - B. Awarded to a graduate related to a past or present member of Fire/EMS/Law Enforcement/Medical AND furthering their education/training following graduation.
  - C. Awarded to a graduate entering Fire/EMS/Law Enforcement/Medical Training (Nursing, Lab Tech etc.)
  - D. Exhibits volunteerism & community service
  - E. Exhibits strong leadership skill as well constantly puts others well-being ahead of their own.
- Criteria A & B: Graduate must include name of relative and their current or previous position
  - Graduate **must** meet A, B, or C criteria in order to have D or E apply.
  - Recipient will be chosen by the Miami School Scholarship Committee.
  - ***Money will be released once proof of acceptance into a training course or program is provided to the Miami Post-Secondary Educational Organization.***
  - Should there be more than 1 qualified graduate; Miami Fire & Rescue reserves the right to split or increase the \$250.00 scholarship.
  - In the event there is no graduate that meets the above criteria, the money shall be given to the Miami Post-Secondary Education Organization for that year to be used towards their budget of continuing education bursaries.

This Scholarship will be offered from **June 2019 to June 2028.**

### **Miami United Church (\$200.00)**

- Awarded to a graduating student who best exemplifies a spirit of Love for Humanity, for God, or for God's creation as expressed through such things as:
- A genuine interest in volunteering his or her service to a community
- A willingness to accept responsibility
- Demonstrating a respectful, courteous, and compassionate attitude
- Post-secondary education is preferred but not required.
- **Must be an active Miami United Church member.**
- The Miami School Scholarship committee will compile a list of graduates who apply and qualify for this scholarship. The top 3 names will be given to the Miami United Church Board for final selection.
- The Miami United Church Board reserves the right to choose the recipient from all of the nominations and to adjust the scholarship as they see fit.

### **Mile 30 Farm Career Scholarship – Todd and Tania Vanstone (\$200.00)**

- Awarded to a student continuing their education in Environmental Science or Agro-Ecology
- Applicant must convey an understanding of land and water stewardship in their portfolio application.
- *Applicant must submit proof of admission to a Post-Secondary Institution for the fall term immediately after their graduation year.*
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and an MPSEO representative will revisit distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

### **Orchard Grain Farms Career Scholarship (\$250.00)**

- Awarded to a student who has expressed interest in pursuing post-secondary studies in an agriculture related field.
- If there is no applicant meeting the above criteria, then preference will be given to a student entering a rural related field. This may include trade options.
- *Money will be released when proof of acceptance into a post-secondary institution is provided. The scholarship may be awarded up to one year after graduation. It is the recipient's responsibility to forward an acceptance letter to the chairperson of MPSEO if they are choosing to wait for a year to attend a post-secondary institution.*
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and an MPSEO representative will revisit distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.
- A family representative will be in attendance to present at graduation.

### **Pembina Creeks Wildlife Association Commercial Studies Scholarship (\$250.00)**

- Awarded to a graduating student continuing his/her education in a business related field.

### **Candice Bergen Leadership Award (\$300.00)**

**THIS IS UNDER REVIEW, the school will be notified whether or not scholarship will be awarded this year.**

- This award is granted to a student who has shown leadership through quite confidence and character rather than one who seeks the limelight,
- Throughout their school career, this individual will have shown leadership through empathy, reliability, compassion and a positive attitude.

**Prairie Red Coats Instrument Performance Scholarship (\$200.00)**

- Awarded to a student who has exhibited a keen interest in the instrumental performing arts.
- This recipient is able to play a minimum of one band instrument.
- Preference will be given to a student that has been involved with a band ensemble.
- The recipient has expressed an interest in continuing to play in a band ensemble.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and an MPSEO representative will revisit distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

**Refined Health (\$200.00)**

- High Marks– to include the following courses at the 40 level: 1 Math, 1 ELA, 1 Science and 2 additional 40 level courses.
- Continuing on to post-secondary education: 1<sup>st</sup> Choice - Health Care, 2<sup>nd</sup> Choice - Agriculture

**Roseisle Friendship Club (\$50.00)**

- Awarded to graduating student from the Roseisle area.
- High marks.

**Ryan Peters Carpentry Career Scholarship (\$200.00)**

- Awarded to a graduating student who has expressed interest in attending a post-secondary institution leading to accreditation in a trades program. Trades may include but are not limited to; Carpentry, Machinist, Electrical, Mechanics, Plumbing, and Welding.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and a MPSEO representative will revisit Distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

**Shear Magic Career Scholarship– Andrew and Jeri Martens (\$200.00)**

- Awarded to a student who has expressed interest in furthering his/her education in cosmetology. This may include hair, nail, and skin care.
- If there is no applicant entering the above field, then 2<sup>nd</sup> choice applicant will be a female entering the trades. In the event that neither of these two criteria apply, it will be awarded to a student pursuing the Mechanics trade.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and a MPSEO representative will revisit distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

### **SJ Agronomy Services Scholarship in Memory of Steve Livingston (\$250.00)**

SJ Agronomy Services is a full-service crop inputs retail located here in Miami. It was founded in 2016 by local agronomists James Oakes and Steve Livingston. Tragically, Steve passed away in 2018. Steve was a proud, enthusiastic community supporter. His passions included agronomy, sports (particularly hockey), and most of all, his family and friends. This scholarship has been created in Steve's memory.

Preference will be given to a graduating student who meets both (or at least one) of these criteria:

- Graduating student pursuing an education in agriculture (or another science program if there are no enrolments in agriculture)
- Graduating student who takes initiative in volunteering within their school and/or community.
- International/Exchange students are not eligible for this scholarship
- SJ Agronomy Services will review and revise the criteria annually with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

### **The Station Bar and Grill Career Scholarship (\$100)**

- Awarded to a student who has expressed interest in pursuing post secondary studies in the culinary arts or the hospitality industry or is interested in obtaining a Business degree or diploma.
- Note: the sponsor and an MPSEO representative will revisit distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this scholarship.
- A family representative will be in attendance to present at graduation.

### **TOPS (amount TBD)**

(Take Off Pounds Sensibly)

- Awarded to a graduate entering a Healthy Living/Health Care/Nutrition related field. May include nursing, phys-ed etc.
- Criteria is not to be "stretched" – stay "true" to criteria.
- ***Funds will be released upon proof of acceptance into a post-secondary education institution.***
- International/Exchange Students are not eligible.

### **Blair Sharpe Dramatic Arts Scholarship (\$500.00)**

- Awarded to a graduating student who is planning to further his/her education/training and who has been involved with the dramatic arts productions at Miami School from grades 9 – 12.
- Preference will be given to a student who has expressed an interest to continue training in the field of dramatic arts and/or the likelihood of his/her participation in amateur or professional theatre is great.
- ***The Scholarship will be awarded once proof of acceptance into a training course or program is provided to the Miami Post-Secondary Educational Organization.***
- ***This Scholarship can be awarded for up to one year after Graduation. It is the recipient's responsibility to forward an acceptance letter to the committee by June 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021.***
- The Post-Secondary Committee will select the recipient on behalf of the family.
- International and Exchange Students are not eligible for this Scholarship.
- Note: the sponsor and a MPSEO representative will revisit distribution of this award yearly before January 31 of the graduation year.
- The Sponsor will review and revise the criteria yearly with a representative of the MPSEO by January 31<sup>st</sup> of the distribution year.

### **MPSEO STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (\$300.00)**

- Awarded to a graduating student who is planning to further his/her education/training in the Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math field.
- Preference will be given to a student who is entering a field of study that requires a higher level of math (e.g. Calculus, Statistics, etc...) for graduation from that faculty.
- Preference will be given to students who have an acceptance into a direct entry STEM faculty.
- ***The Scholarship will be awarded once proof of acceptance into a training course or program is provided to the Miami Post-Secondary Educational Organization.***
- ***This Scholarship can be awarded for up to one year after Graduation. It is the recipient's responsibility to forward an acceptance letter to the committee by June 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021.***

#### **Miami Moose Bursary (\$100.00)**

- presented to a female graduate who has demonstrated a dedication to athletics and their community and has an intent to further their education.

#### **Patrick Mowbray Memorial (plaque & cheque \$500 if single recipient or \$300 each if 2 recipients)**

- Recipient chosen by faculty and staff – (Teachers, E.A.'s, Custodians, Secretaries, Librarians, Noon Hour Supervisors etc.) Not to be included as part of the portfolio process.

#### **Prairie Rose Teachers' Association Career Scholarship (\$500.00)**

- Recipient to be decided upon by all of the teachers within Miami School.
- Awarded to a graduating student who is continuing into post-secondary education.
- Priority will be given to a graduate going into a field related to teaching and/or early childhood. This includes a student working towards social work, or clinical skills that will be used in a school setting (eg. speech pathology). If there is no graduate that fits this criteria the teachers can decide on a deserving student for the award.

#### **School Spirit Award (plaques & \$50 each from Student Council)**

- Two graduates who best exemplify School Spirit.

- Most Improved Average Gr. 11 to 12

### **Catherine Orchard Scholarship – Offered Until Grad 2035 (\$200.00)**

- Students must have attended Miami School from Kindergarten to Grade 12.
- Highest Math average obtained from grade 9, 10, 11, 12 regardless of level of Math studied.
- This award will continue until Grad 2043

### **Governor General's Bronze Medal (medal only)**

- Awarded to the student who achieves the **highest average** upon graduation. The average includes all **grade 11 and grade 12 courses** as listed on the student's Red Coat official transcript. It must be calculated based on **final** results after the provincial examinations. (One winner only, responsibility of school to choose one if there is a tie.)

### **University of Manitoba Chown (\$1000.00)**

(U of M requests the names of 2 alternates)

- The best "all-around" student graduating from high school
- Grade 12 average of 85% or greater in courses which meet the University of Manitoba admissions criteria
- Recommendation for the award by their high school
- Admission to any University of Manitoba program.

#### **(Academic Excellence & School & Community Service Award)**

- Honour roll student for the past two years.
- Participation in extra-curricular and volunteer activities in both school and community.

- The recipient will be determined by a vote of all Grade 12 students.

### **Prairie Rose School Division (\$200.00)**

#### **(Diligent Commitment to Learning)**

- Awarded to a graduating student who, irrespective of ability, has diligently pursued his/her studies through the high school years and has demonstrated a commitment to learning.
- Candidates must be nominated by the Grade 12 students.
- The recipient will be determined by a vote of all the Grade 12 students.
